Insurance/Loss Control

Service of Alcohol Off Premises

There have been numerous occasions where commercial event sponsors attempt to have Lodges serve alcoholic beverages at such events for a percentage of the proceeds, but the Lodges must provide the liquor liability insurance. This is not acceptable. Nor is it acceptable for Lodges to utilize the Lodge's liquor license to serve at off-premises events as a method of fund raising.

The Elks cannot afford to allow Elks Lodges to misuse the self-insured Grand Lodge Master Liability Program in this fashion. The GL Master Liability Program assumes the first \$750,000 of each and every occurrence. Lodge assessments are predicated on the

normal exposure derived from Lodge operations, not on expanded, less controllable exposures outside the Lodge. Therefore the Grand Lodge Insurance Department will not allow certificates of insurance to be issued naming anyone as an additional insured if alcohol service is involved.

Cameras

It is strongly suggested that every Lodge have a Polaroid or a one-time use disposable camera available. The camera can be used to take pictures at the Lodge when there is an alleged defect in the facilities, or a loss. It is very helpful to have photos taken at the time of the incident, or occurrence. Make sure the camera is available to the person on duty, such as the manager or bartender, and not just the Lodge Officers.
